
## Technology Demo and Petting Zoo


### TALKING PICTURES

### MULBERRY CHILD

**Monday, December 17, at 1:00 & 7:00 p.m.**

Narrated by Jacqueline Bisset, the documentary *Mulberry Child* is two stories in one. The film recreates some of the events of Jian Ping's moving memoir about difficulties faced by her family during China's Cultural Revolution. At the same time, *Mulberry Child* chronicles the 2008 return to China by Jian and her daughter, Lisa. The trip manages to accomplish for mother and daughter what the book itself could not: instilling in the daughter both a stronger sense of her own history and feeling of greater closeness to her family.

### AI WEIWEI: NEVER SORRY

Ai Weiwei is a Chinese artist, filmmaker and even a part-time architect. However, it is his combination of art and activism with which Ai Weiwei has achieved both his greatest fame and a notoriety that threatens his freedom in China. From 2008 to 2010, filmmaker Alison Klayman was allowed unprecedented access to the artist, as he readied his work major exhibitions around the world, while frequently taking his government to task via social media. Almost universally acclaimed, *Ai Weiwei: Never Sorry* is "...enthralling, but it's not over, and there's no telling where it's going. Which makes what we see on screen all the more involving." — Kenneth Turan, *Los Angeles Times*.

### SEARCHING FOR SUGAR MAN

Occasionally, truth is stranger and more satisfying than fiction. Such a true story is told in *Searching for Sugar Man*. A little-known Detroit singer-songwriter named Rodriguez made two albums in the early 1970s and then disappeared into obscurity. Unknown in America, Rodriguez's music was discovered by South Africans, where it eventually rivaled the likes of the Beatles in popularity. When some of Rodriguez's most avid fans set out to determine how and where he died, they're in for the surprise of their lives. *Searching for Sugar Man* is "an electrifying illustration of music's power to inspire and change lives on both sides of the footlights." — Colin Covert, *Minneapolis Star Tribune*.

### GET HELP WITH YOUR RESEARCH PROJECTS

Finding the right books for big research assignments can be tough. We've made some changes that should make it a bit easier to find what you need. When you browse the library shelves, look for a big, bright-red YA label on books in both the adult and the children's nonfiction collections. This label tells you that the book is written at a level of vocabulary and detail that should work for you. When you use the catalog, you can identify these books by typing your subject and the words "Central School Research" into the search box. For example, if you type in "global warming Central School Research," you will get a list of 13 titles that should provide the kind of information you need. And remember, we WANT to help you with your project, so please ask for help.
